Ranch Versatility was introduced back into the Club by Colleen Collins and now led by the talented and dedicated Matt Tomlinson and his subcommittee.


Versatility Ranch is an exciting journey that has captured the hearts of many members, and we cannot wait to share all the wonderful aspects of this dynamic discipline with you.

TIPS & TRICKS

EVOLVE EQUINE

Reining, cutting, & camp drafting horses all develop a muscle pattern different to any other discipline of the horse. The front two legs of a reining horse carry not only the rider, but the impact of high speeds into stops, with turns, circles as well as 62 percent of its own body weight on top of this. It is safe to say the reining horses front limbs have the maximum stress load on its fore hand out of any other discipline. Any assistance your horse can get from proper shoeing and muscle care can mean the difference between a long successful career in the arena and a shortened one due to soft tissue injuries.

We all want our horses to be able to perform to the best of their ability and we know that an effective training regime has many facets. The horse must be worked correctly, fed balanced ration, be mentally and physically healthy and well looked after.

No horse has perfect condition, but no matter what their physical characteristics all horses have the same biomechanical function. The better the horse's conformation and physique the more effective it will be in biomechanical terms.

Body work through tactile therapy, works with a variety of means to increase muscular flexibility, increase circulation of blood and oxygen which aids for a faster muscle contraction, therefore increasing strength in manoeuvres. It increases muscle tone by stimulating neuro-elasticity, which encourages faster tissue responses from the brain. This in turn, helping reduce muscle fatigue, scar tissue, nerve tension and even stress hormones which all aids for a happy and functional horse. By treating your horse with body work, either regularly or intermittently, your horse's ability to recover from fatigue will increase, soft tissue injuries will decrease considerably, and muscle, tendon and ligament abilities will increase.

Body work is not only beneficial to a horse's physical ability, but also to aid in balancing a horse's conformation. Balance is crucial in all successful horses and should be considered seriously when scouting for your next potential mount. Overall balance comes from looking at the horse (side on) in three sections: the front end (including the head and neck), the midsection, and the hind end. There should be a balance between the slope of the shoulder, the slope of the hip, and the slope of the pasterns. If the neck is long, then the hip should have a long slope. This creates balance and a balanced horse travels more correctly, generally stays sounder, and handles manoeuvres more easily as he is not fighting a balance issue. Equine tactile therapists are specialised at looking at a horse from 6 angles of balance: near side, offside, caudal aspect, cranial aspect, above and below.


If a horse is using its body in an unfavourable manner from a pain source or over-activation of a certain muscles, body work can reduce these uneven developments and give exercises to encourage the horse to move itself in ways that defy the physiological adaptation to an original pain source.


